PRAYERS

Mr. McRae for Mr. Campbell (LaSalle-Émard-Côte Saint-Paul), from the Standing Committee on Transport and Communications, presented the Fourth Report of the Committee, which is as follows:

Pursuant to its Order of Reference of Thursday, December 19, 1974, your Committee has considered Bill S-18, An Act respecting International Air Transport Association, and has agreed to report it without amendment.

A copy of the Minutes of Proceedings and Evidence relating to this Bill (*Issues Nos. 6 and 7*) is tabled.

Mr. Turner (Ottawa-Carleton), a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid upon the Table,—Exchange of correspondence relating to Syncrude Project.—*Sessional Paper No. 301-5/100.*

The House resumed debate on the motion of Mr. Turner (Ottawa-Carleton), seconded by Mr. Sharp,—That Bill C-49, An Act to amend the statute law relating to income tax, be now read a second time and referred to a Committee of the Whole.

And on the motion of Mr. Lawrence, seconded by Mr. Baker (Grenville-Carleton), in amendment thereto,—That all the words after "That" be struck out and the following substituted therefor:

"this House declines to give second reading to Bill C-49, An Act to amend the statute law relating to income tax, because it fails to provide for a further 5% reduction in personal income tax in the 1975 and subsequent taxation years despite unprecedented government revenues and the resulting overtaxation by the Government."

And debate continuing;

Mr. Broadbent, seconded by Mr. Knowles (Winnipeg North Centre), proposed to move in amendment to the amendment,—That the amendment be amended by deleting therefrom the words "a further 5% reduction" and by substituting therefor the words "a \$400 tax credit".
