On motion, it was—

Ordered, That an Order of the Senate do issue for a Return showing:—

1. What has been the cost of the Civil Service Commission for the years 1934, 1935, and 1936?

2. Over what classes of civil servants have they the right to make appointments?

3. How many appointments have been made during the said years, and what were the salaries in each case?

The Honourable Senator Dandurand laid on the Table return forthwith.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Honourable Senator Little moved that the Bill (C), intituled: "An Act respecting Central Finance Corporation and to change its name to Household Finance Corporation," be now read a third time.

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That a Message be sent to the House of Commons to acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill, without any amendment.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day the Bill (H), intituled: "An Act respecting Industrial Loan and Finance Corporation," was read the third time.

The question was put whether this Bill shall pass.

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill, to which they desire their concurrence.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Bill (A-2), intituled: "An Act for the relief of Eva Schiller Lightstone," was, on division, read the second time, and—

Ordered, That it be placed on the Orders of the Day for a third reading to-morrow.
