Mr. MAYHEW: From December 1, 1941 to May 20, 1946, the ceiling prices on corn starch and on glucose were their basic period prices (i.e. maximum price established in the fourweek period September 15 to October 11, 1941). On May 20, 1946, the rate of subsidy on imported corn was reduced and compensating increases of 1½ cents per pound at the manufacturers' level on both starch and glucose were authorized.
