HEALTH AND WELFARE

MEDICARE—REQUEST FOR ASSURANCE AS TO IMPLEMENTATION OF PLAN

Mr. T. C. Douglas (Burnaby-Coquitlam): Mr. Speaker, may I ask the right hon. Prime Minister a question. Having regard to the statement of the Minister of Finance that prior to July 1 he is prepared to undertake discussions with the provinces regarding the implementation of medicare, I ask the Prime Minister whether the commitment he gave to the house on February 12, that medicare would commence on July 1 of this year, is binding upon the Liberal government irrespective of who may head the administration.

Right Hon. L. B. Pearson (Prime Minister): Mr. Speaker, there has been no change in that commitment.

Mr. Douglas: May I ask a supplementary question, Mr. Speaker. Is it possible for a minister to remain in the cabinet when he is advocating policies which are diametrically opposed to the policy enunciated by the Prime Minister?
