

Mr. David Lewis (York South): Mr. Speaker, I know hon. members, myself included, would have liked to see the debate on this stage of the bill ended tonight.

Mr. Nielsen: Then let us vote now.

Mr. Lewis: I am sorry I want to take a minute or two, if I may, to say three things as simply as I can. The first is that the hon. member for Edmonton West (Mr. Lambert) entered into another fallacy when he said that we have to have a ceiling in the act in order for parliament to supervise the expenditures. I say to him that the opposite is the case. The ceiling in the statute enables the government to make advances without reference to parliament, whereas if there is no ceiling such money will have to be put in the estimates and parliament will have to consider and study such expenditure.

Mr. Speaker: Order, please. I have to interrupt the hon. member for York South. I have no alternative but to call it ten o'clock, unless there is unanimous agreement to continue.

Mr. Baldwin: Mr. Speaker, we would suggest that the debate continue and be concluded tonight.

Mr. MacEachen: Mr. Speaker, we are quite agreeable to allowing the debate to continue until the hon. member concludes his remarks, and then if it is the wish of the House we will stay to dispose of the second reading motion.

Mr. Lewis: Mr. Speaker, much as I might think of words that I want to utter, I do not think they are important enough for me to inconvenience Members of Parliament, and my remarks are ended.
