ILLEGAL CATCHES BY UNITED STATES FISHERMEN ON BROWN'S BANK—REQUEST FOR UNANIMOUS CONSENT TO MOVE MOTION

Mr. Charles E. Haliburton (South Western Nova): Mr. Speaker, I wish to present a motion of urgent and pressing necessity under the provisions of Standing Order 43. It is one which is indeed of urgent and pressing necessity in my area of this country. It arises as a result of the ICNAF agreement which was reached in July 1973 and which was thought by Nova Scotia fishermen to protect a defined area known as Brown's Bank from fishing during a defined time of the year. In the last few weeks United States fishermen have been fishing in that area during the restricted period. I therefore move, seconded by the hon. member for Central Nova (Mr. MacKay):

That this House direct the Secretary of State for External Affairs to promptly intervene with the United States government in order to request the immediate withdrawal of United States nationals fishing in the area of Brown's Bank, a protected area under the ICNAF agreement and, further, that this House direct the Standing Committee on Fisheries and Forestry to convene within 24 hours to investigate fully the circumstances which have led to a situation where Canadian fishermen are the only group legally prohibited from fishing in an area lying within 200 miles of our coastline.

Mr. Speaker: Is there unanimous consent?

Some hon. Members: Agreed.

Some hon. Members: No.

Mr. Speaker: There is not unanimous consent. The motion cannot be put.
