Your petitioners strongly oppose the clause in Bill C-21 which has reduced adoptive parent leave from 15 weeks to 10 weeks while, at the same time, increasing biological parent leave to 25 weeks. The petitioners call upon Parliament to amend Bill C-21 with respect to adoptive parental leave and that all parents, whether biological or adoptive, receive the same paid leave to enable them to spend time with their new child or children.
