Mr. Blake—On Wednesday next—ORDER OF THE HOUSE for a Strtement of any information in the possession of the Government as to the number of persons counted during the last Census, though absent from the place in which they were counted; distinguishing by Provinces, and also distinguishing between those said to be absent (1) in other parts of the same Province, (2) in other parts of Canada, (3) in the United States, and (4) in other foreign parts.

Also for a Statement of the means (if any) taken to ascertain how many absentees were counted; and to guard against those who had left permanently, and against those who were present only temporarily being counted.

Also for a Statement of the means (if any) to be taken during the next Census to secure the suggested information, and to guard against the suggested defect in the taking of the next Census.

Mr. Blake—On Wednesday next—ADDRESS to His Excellency the Governor General for Copies of all Despatches and Correspondence on the subject of Emigration from Ireland or other parts of the United Kingdom to the North West and other parts of Canada.

Mr. Blake—On Wednesday next—ENQUIRY OF MINISTRY—Whether the Government has received any Despatch trom the Imperial Government on the subject of Irish or other immigration to the North-West or other parts of Canada; and whether any such Despatch will be laid on the Table?

Mr. Bergeron-On Wednesday next-ADDRESS to His Excellency the Governor General for copy of the Order in Council reinstating J. F. Béique, Esquire, Superintendent of Beauharnois Canal after the Enquête which took place against him last Summer; also the correspondence between the Government and the Engineer of Canals, Parent, relating to such re-instatement.
