McCord Museum.

After careful thought, I think the Sub-Committee on "Accessions" might be composed of Dr. Fryer and Mr. Gammell, with myself, as proposed by you. Both these gentlemen have not only considerable knowledge of Canadian history and "antiquities", but also of the "teaching value" of the material. This latter point involves the consideration that it is not only what we accept, but how we arrange, enter and inscribe it, that will bring the educative results it ought to have. Consequently, these points ought also, I think, to be within the scope of the same Committee, - the whole of course, subject to the General Committee.

This division would allot the business questions to the business Sub-Committee, and the educative to the educational; with the General Committee as the clearing house. The Museum should now go harmoniously forward.

The above are merely my suggestions. I do not dogmatize about them.
