LUSTY CLUB SINGING GAVE MAPLE LEAFS VICTORY OVER PESTS

Kelleyites Hit Two Jersey City Pitchers to All Corners and Tallied Eight Times—Kroy and Hugh Bradley the Chief Swatmen.

JERSEY CITY, N.J., Aug. 13.—(Special.)—Joe Kelley's Maple Leafs avoided the necessity of extra innings in today's game with Jersey City by copping the victory this afternoon in the fourth inning, when they succeeded in routing the fourth tally across the rubber. Not content to rest on their laurels in scoring, the visitors kept hammering away at the opposing pitchers and after stinging Andy Cookley's twisters for six hits and the four runs, Kelley's men came back with the same number of tallies on Verbut and seven safeties when he was substituted for the first runner after four and two-third innings had been decided, the final being Toronto 8, Jersey City 3.
