


SYNOPSIS OF DOMINION LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY PERSON who is the so le head o

ANY PERSON who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the Dustrict. Entry by proxy may be made at any Agency, on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader. Dutles : Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead-on a farm of at least 80 acres, solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain Districts a homestead in each of or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry lincluding the time required to earn homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased home-stead or incernain districts. Price, \$3.00 per acre. Dutles : Must reside upon the home-stead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry lincluding the time required to earn homestead patent, and cultivate fifty acres extra. 


