Democratic Leaders Confident That Senate Will Adopt Panama Bill.

WASHINGTON, May 22.—Democratic leaders in the senate were confident tonight that the Panama Canal tolls exemption repeal bill and the arbitration amendments will be disposed of next week. Senator Kern, leader of the majority, said a vote would be taken May 26 or shortly afterwards, and added that the repeal bill would be passed by a majority of at least ten.

Senator Simmons returned to the senate today after a short lilness with measles. He took up the fight for repeal at once, and will direct the administration forces until the vote is taken. He will speak for repeal early next week.
