

Institute on the Aya-pana.—This plant is a native of America, and grows in abundance on the banks of the river Amazon. It possesses the property of curing very speedily the bite of snakes, and wounds made by poisoned arrows. It is esteemed a powerful sudorific, and a specific against the dropsy, we are indebted for a knowledge of this plant to capt. Baudin, brother to the celebrated navigator who is now exploring the Islands of the South: having learnt the virtues of it from the natives, he resolved to raise it in the Isle of France, and was at much pains to procure a root of it, which he planted in a botanic garden in that Island. As the Aya-pana is propagated by scions, it is rapidly multiplied. Its properties are not fictitious; the bite of a snake has been cured in 24 hours: and a negro afflicted with the dropsy found immediate relief by the use of it. Capt. Baudin has sent some of the leaves and seeds to Madam Bonaparte, and to Citizen Juffieu. The leaves were delivered to Citizen Alibert, a physician, to try their medicinal qualities. A drawing and description of the plant will be given in the first number of the "Treatise on the Plants in the Garden of Malmaison."
