JAPANESE CABINET OFFERS TO RESIGN

Bribery Charges Against Min er Precipitate Step by Premier Okuma.

CCEPTED BY MIKADO

Proposal Made for Recon struction With Okuma as Chief.

TOKIO, July 30 .- The Japanese Cab net, headed by Count Okuma, the pr mier, has tendered its resignation to En peror Yoshihito. This action followed t resignation yesterday of Viscount Kantake Oura, minister of the interior, for lowing an investigation by the minist of justice into bribery charges resulting from the parliamentary elections 1

Viscount Oura's resignation was san tioned by the emperor after a report the situation had been made to him

the situation had been made to him by Count Okuma.

Premier Okuma, believing he should hold himself responsible for the acts of the members of his cabinet, was the first to tender his resignation. The other ministers immediately decided to follow the example of their chief. After receiving Count Okuma, the emperor summoned the elder statesmen for a conference. A cabinet change at this time is unpopular with the public because of the war.

Two cases have been mentioned as responsible for the crisis. The first was the charge that 10,000 yen (\$5000) had been offered Viscount Oura by a candidate for the house as the price for keeping a rival candidate out of the field. The minister of the interior denied having accepted this bribe, but K. Hayashida, chief secretary of the lower house, who was arrested Wednesday, has been quoted as admitting receiving the money and distributing it for campaign purposes.

The second case involves two representatives charged with accepting bribes to desert the Selyuk, or Conservative party, and support the government in its campaign for an increase in the army.
