JOE WOOD OF BOSTON LEADS AM. PITCHERS

Walter Johnson Second With Nearly Twice the Number of Games.

CHICAGO, Dec. 6.—Joe Wood of Boston is placed first among the American League pitchers for this season, according to the official records announced today. He took part in 35 games, and the average number of earned runs scored against him per game was 1.49. Walter Johnson of Washington was second, having pitched 47 games and allowed 1.55 earned runs per game. Shore of Boston was third with 1.84 runs to the game against him, having pitched 28 during the season. The following is the official list:

U. S. CONGRESS OPENS IMPORTANT SESSION

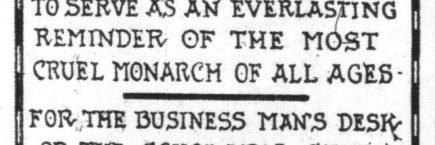
President's Address to Joint Session to Be Delivered at Noon Today.

PRACTICALLY RUINED BY FEDERAL LAWSUIT

New Haven Railway Suffered Severely by Agreement With Grand Trunk.

NEW YORK, Dec. 6.—The federal prosecution of the New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad and its directors accomplished the "practical ruin" of that railroad, in the opinion of Charles S. Melien, as expressed on cross-examination today at the trial of the seven former directors of the road on the charge of criminal violation of the Sherman law.

It was from Melien's statement, that this would be the result of the enquiry into New Haven affairs, begun in 1912 by the federal grand jury in New York that he got Lewis Cass Leary to see President Taft and the then attorney-general, George W. Wickersham, and induce them at least to limit the enquiry to the so-called Grand Trunk deal—the alleged suppression of the Grand Trunk's supposed New England extensions.

"This was done," continued Mr. Melien, "but it meant indictment and my destruction, and the rest they accomplished later."

Mr. Melien pictured the Grand Trunk's activities in extending its lines into New England, not as having been designed for the purpose of legitimate competition with the New Haven, but as a threat to force the New Haven to surrender its position with the latter's traffic relations with the Canadian Pacific, the Grand Trunk's chief rival.

The agreement was of such an advantageous character to the Grand Trunk, said Mr. Melien, that when it was reached it required a modification of the New Haven's arrangement with the Canadian Pacific on a lower basis.

FORWARD MOVEMENT FOR MONTREAL STOCKS

Cement and Scotia Most Active—Hollinger Mining Makes New High Record.

MONTREAL, Dec. 6.—In the absence of any large offerings on the local stock exchange today, prices in some cases moved forward readily. Cement and Scotia were the most active features, the former touching 44, a rise of five points from the low of last week, and of 1 1/2 from the final level of Saturday.

While the latter touched 93, or about 4 points higher than the level of Saturday, closing at the best, and forgoing, which rose 1/2 to a new high of 20 1/2, and closed at 20 1/2.

Iron and Steel of Canada reflected up from last week's low, and closed at 47 1/2 and 4 1/2 respectively. General Electric rose 1 1/2 to 11 1/2, and closed at 11 1/2.

Bel Telephone, Textile, Power, Detroit and others were firm and for the most part higher at the close. Canadian Cotton common and Textile were higher.

Hunger continued a prevailing feature of the mining division and sold at a new high record price of \$29 in the afternoon.

Total business 7183 shares, 570 mines, \$19,700 bonds.

LONDON STOCK EXCHANGE.

LONDON, Dec. 6.—Money was in fair demand, and discount rates were easy today. Treasury bills were sold freely at the Bank of England. American exchange was firmer on numerous sales, and cable transfers advanced to 47 1/2 to 47 1/2. Paris exchange improved, but Petrograd eased off.

The stock market was quiet. The feature of the trading was a broadening interest in Kafirs on buying by provincial as well as big houses. The selling of American bonds continued in good volume, and the ticker contained a large number of markings at rather irregular prices. British funds were firm, but American securities were comparatively quiet on the rise in exchange rates. The closing was steady.

CANADIAN FISH FOR CANADIAN SOLDIERS
