Official circles are very reticent, but the statement is confidently made in quarters generally well posted that the French Government is preparing to accept the inevitable in the Upper Nile and leave England in undisputed control of the whole Nile valley. If this be so Lord Salisbury at last has put his foot down with signal success, for those who watch French policy closely say there is no doubt of the carefully-thought-out joint design of the French expeditions, provided with Government paid forces and supplies, to seize upon the waters of the Nile above Khartoum, and, in fact, to carry out a scheme-openly attributed to the present Minister, M. Lebon—to establish a direct line of communication by French posts from

Even upon these early indications of the French inclination to stand aside, the British Ministers are being again strongly urged by the "Forwards" within their party to see that before the session of 1899 closes the Egyptian army may be given the help of British Indian forces to finally end the Dervish rule throughout the Nile Valley. These bold spirits forget that just now India herself needs every soldier she can raise. It is understood, however, that the British Ministry has arranged to attach a small British force of 3000 men to the Egyptian army for the advance on Khartoum next year, the battalions of the Guards and the 1st Manchester Regiments, both now at Gibraltar, forming part of the force.

Of course these reports of French acquiescence in England's complete domination of the Upper Nile country encourage suggestions of English concessions elsewhere. Under-Secretary Curzon, who, as the representative of the Foreign Office in the House of Commons, takes upon himself the exposition of Lord Salisbury's views on public platforms, made it clear in addressing his Lancashire constituents last night that these concessions, if anywhere, certainly would not be in Nigerland. His words were almost defiant.

"Where," he said, "British interests are involved or British honor is at stake, there let us stand up for our rights, as upon the Niger, or replace anarchy by settled order, as in the valleys of the Upper Nile."
