TO CONSIDER INTER-URBANS DETROIT MAY BE HANDED OVER CONTROL OF ITS STREET RAILWAY

New York Capitalist Has Scheme to Aid Municipal Ownership and at Same Time Benefit His Own Interests.

Detroit, May 7.—From eastern sources it is ascertained that there is a new plan on foot for the final disposition of the Detroit United Railway, which, even if it is not carried out, is decidedly unique, and therefore interesting.
