Inspector Chapman Explains Why This Small Percentage of Scholars Passed Entrance Examination.

Concerning the number of successful candidates at the recent examinations, Inspector Chapman said last night: "The percentage of successful candidates this year is slightly lower than last, but the conditions under which the candidates wrote were greatly changed. Last year candidates were required to secure one-third of the marks on each subject and 50 per cent. of the whole. This year 40 per cent. on each subject and 60 per cent. of the whole is demanded, which renders the examinations rather more severe.
