COMPLETE PLANS TO DEPOSIT COLORS OF 33RD IN ST. PAUL'S

Impressive Ceremony To Take Place Thursday Morning—Lieut. Col. Rance To Command.

Final arrangements were made at a meeting at the G. W. V. A. building last night for the ceremony of depositing the colors of the 33rd Battalion, C.E.F., in St. Paul's Cathedral Thursday morning.

The men will fall in at the armories and march to St. Paul's, arriving there at 11:15 in command of Lieut. Col. H. T. Rance, formerly second in command of the battalion. He expected that 300 or 400 will be in line.

The same color party, which bore the colors when they were deposited in Canterbury Cathedral in 1916, will assist Thursday. Bishop Williams will officiate and deliver a short address. The 33rd Battalion band will accompany the parade.

As the colors were presented to the battalion by the I.O.D.E., regents of that organization will occupy the chancel. The military will use the main entrance to the cathedral, and civilians the north and south doors. Space will be also allotted to the members of the I.O.D.E.

After the ceremony the men will march to Carling House, where they will have dinner and prepare for the afternoon parade.

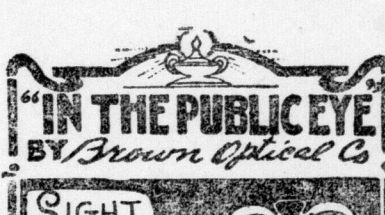
