





MODEL CITY FOR THE SOUTH SHORE

Tight Money Delays Scheme to Build New Municipality Opposite Montreal.

MONTREAL, May 17.—(Special).—Delayed from completion only by the extreme tightness of the money market is a ten-million dollar deal on the south shore. Most of the money required for the enormous scheme of the promoters has been subscribed, and will be available just the moment that there is a loosening up in the purse

strings of the financial magnates. The larger part of the cash is said to be coming from across the ocean from French and Belgian capitalists.

It is generally understood in the best informed real estate circles that the ten million dollars scheme is connected with the south shore model city that has been rumored so many times. That plan involves a great block of land in the neighborhood of Longueuil, between that place and St. Lambert. Owners declare that the site of the investment is around the land that was secured a year or more ago by the D. & H. Railway for shops and other purposes.

From what can be learned it is likely that the intention of the company is to build a model town on the south shore. Streets would be built, sewers, water, gas and electric light installed. Then self-contained houses will be erected, a house of some value that the man of ordinary income could purchase it.

Borden Not Sorry If Election Forced

Birmingham Post Thinks Navy Bill Has Fair Prospects of Success.

LONDON, May 17.—(C.A.P.).—English papers apparently have about exhausted their views on the Canadian naval bill. Very few comment on the passing of the bill thru the lower house, although cables describing the process have been fairly lengthy.

There is a striking exception, however, in today's Birmingham Post, the paper generally regarded to be much under the Chamberlain family influence. The Post thinks the bill goes to the senate with fair prospects, and proceeds to quote:

"It is peculiarly unfortunate that it should be an extremely important

scheme of practical imperialism which has aroused such unprecedented hostility in the legislature. We may perhaps venture to conjecture that if the bill were defeated in the senate and a fresh appeal to the electors became necessary, the prime minister himself would not be wholly sorry. The chances should be given him to appeal for a special direct mandate upon his naval schemes."

The Pall Mall Gazette says the rejection of the bill would raise a constitutional question of first importance. The second chamber's position is as much an anachronism in Canada as here. The Spectator thinks in the event of the rejection Premier Borden would very likely go to the country on a strong platform, namely, an honorable expenditure on naval protection of Canadian commerce and the reform of the senate.

LONDON, May 17.—The militant suffragettes this morning made a slight change in their arson campaign. Instead of setting fire to unoccupied houses they attempted to destroy a furnished residence at Cambridge. The interior woodwork was greatly damaged and one of the university laboratories adjoining also suffered. Another canister of gunpowder and slugs was found at Boxmoor station in Hertfordshire, on the London and Northwestern Railway, today.
