

the case of the blind Postmaster-General of England, the removal of one sense was almost made up by the more acute and sensitive power acquired by the others, viz. : touch, hearing and smell. Some one having given him a faithful, intelligent dog, he was able to visit the neighboring farms by himself ; then he sent seven dollars to be invested by your visitor in articles of constant use. These were sent, together with packages of tracts and papers to be scattered amongst the homesteads as he did his little trade. The \$7 produced \$13, that \$23, and this week \$43 is received and invested in seasonable, easily-carried goods ; but " Levi's Mother " writes, " It is not the money she regards at all, it is the new life developed in the blind lad, the wonderful facility he displays as to the goods, not to speak of the good he does scattering seeds of eternal truth in the printed pages he carries with him, and which all and sundry carefully read out of sympathy and pity for the giver, let us hope to their own everlasting good."

VISITATION AT THE JAIL has been almost a blank, owing to circumstances over which the Association has no control. Individual prisoners have been dealt with and followed up after completing their sentence, but it would not be judicious to go further into detail, though much that is of interest might be told were it wise to do so. Let believing prayer be continued that the limited opportunities afforded for intercourse with the prisoners may be blessed and acknowledged as in the past.
