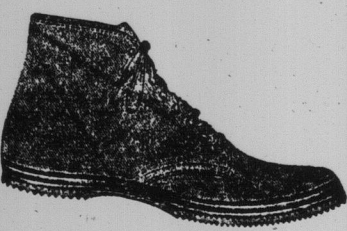

URGENT UNNATURALIZED HUNS TO GET OUT ON U. S. FARMS

New York, June 1.—Unnaturalized Germans, hundreds of whom have been discharged by public service corporations and other private concerns, were advised today by United States Marshal McCarthy to "get out on farms somewhere." If they are physically fit. This advice was the Marshal's reply to many appeals from Germans yesterday when the government's restrictions on all water fronts as well as forts and arsenals were drawn tighter as a result of apparent activities of Teutonic plotters.

The ban is expected to be carried so far as to prohibit absolutely the use by Germans of even private craft on any of the waterways about the port.

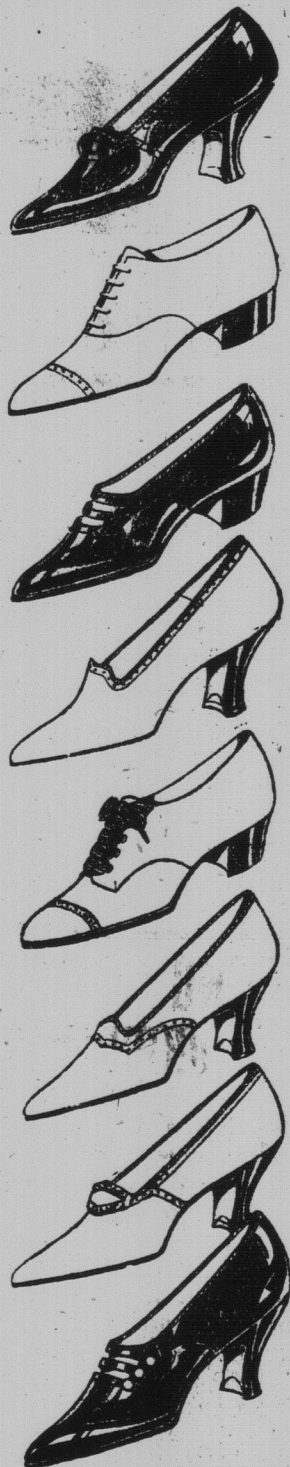

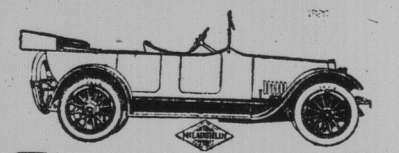

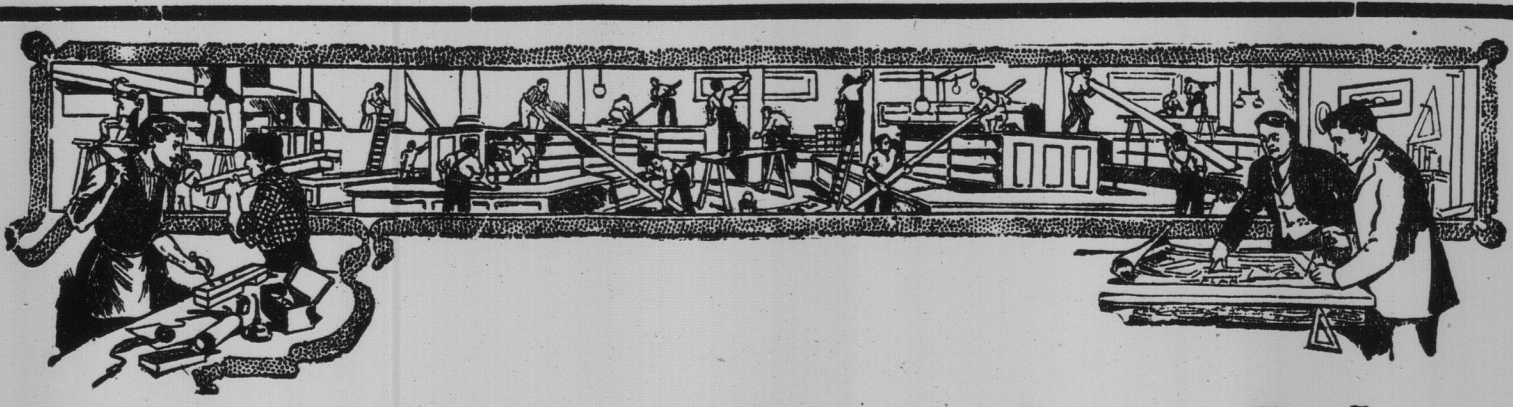
