FORMS FOR INCOME STATEMENT ISSUED

Those For Individuals Due on Feb. 10, For Employes January 10

The forms which have to be filled out by all city ratepayers, showing inout by all city ratepayers, showing income and personal property valuations for assessment purposes are being sent out this week by the Board of Assessors. These have to be properly filled out and returned to the office of the assessors on or before February 10. Unless the person failing to file before the expiration of the period can furnish an excuse satisfactory to the assessors, they have the power to fix a sessors, they have the power to fix a valuation and as a penalty for not filing, double the amount for the current

year.
Schedules from employers showing the number of employes liable to taxation are due to be filed with the assessors on or before January 10.

Some thought that if the employer submitted the name of a ratepayer on his schedule this entitled the one to the exemption, but this was not the case. In order to get the benefit of this exemption, each person must file a sworn statement setting forth the amount of income and the number of dependent children.


