

NO DECISION AS TO PURCHASE OF BUILDING HERE

N. B. Government Discusses Matter—Report on Immigration Is Given

Owing to the absence of Hon. C. T. Richards in Fredericton, Hon. Dr. H. I. Taylor, M. L. A., and Hon. L. P. D. Tilley in the West Indies, not very much business was transacted at the meeting of the government held here yesterday, Hon. Dr. Baxter said this morning. Hon. E. A. Reilly, M. L. A., also was absent part of the time, as the New Brunswick Power Commission, of which he is the chairman, was holding sessions.

The matter of the purchase of a building in Saint John for government purposes, received consideration, Hon. Dr. Baxter said, and the question was discussed with Garret Wilson, architect, but no decision was reached.

Hon. J. A. Murray, immigration commissioner for the province, waited on the Government last evening and presented the agreement between the province and the Federal government in regard to aiding immigration to this province. The agreement met with the approval of the government, and it is expected that a definite announcement in regard to its provisions will be made soon. It was said like agreements will be entered into between the three Maritime Provinces and the Federal government.

The government will meet again in Fredericton on January 18.

FORMS FOR INCOME STATEMENT ISSUED

Those For Individuals Due on Feb. 10, For Employers January 10

The forms which have to be filled out by all city ratepayers, showing income and personal property valuations for assessment purposes are being sent out this week by the Board of Assessors. These have to be properly filled out and returned to the office of the assessors on or before February 10. Unless the person failing to file before the expiration of the period can furnish an excuse satisfactory to the assessors, they have the power to fix a valuation and as a penalty for not filing, double the amount for the current year.

Schedules from employers showing the number of employees liable to taxation are due to be filed with the assessors on or before January 10. The chairman of the board this morning called attention to a misunderstanding which he said had arisen in connection with the exemption to married men with one or more dependent children. Some thought that if the employer submitted the name of a ratepayer on his schedule this entitled the one to the exemption, but this was not the case. In order to get the benefit of this exemption, each person must file a sworn statement setting forth the amount of income and the number of dependent children.

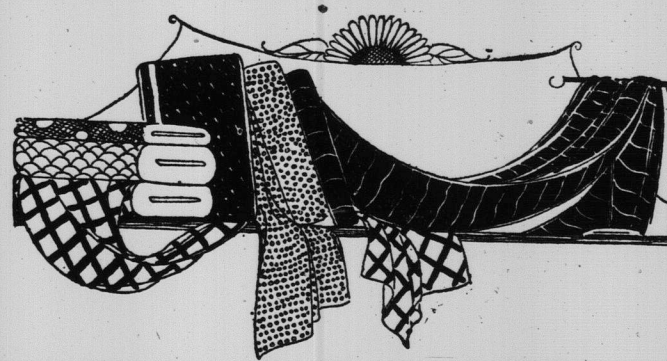
