MORNING NEWS OVER THE WIRES

The congregation of the Church of the Assumption, Grand Falls, have erected a very handsome monument to the memory of the late Rev. Henry T. Joyner, for sixteen years parish priest there. Father Joyner was an Englishman and in his young days was a member of the Anglican church.

MOCK TRIAL.

A civil case involving an action in tort for damages sustained in an alleged automobile action at the corner of King and Germain streets was argued by the King's College law students last night.
