### DEMAND BETTER FACILITIES FOR ATLANTIC PORTS

Maritime Board of Trade Deals With Transportation Problems and Matters of Taxation

Newcastle, N. B., Aug. 20.—The necessity of increasing the harbor facilities at St. John and Railway, the reduction of I. C. R. freight rates, better transportation arrangements for Prince Edward Island, the adoption of modified single tax system and other matters of importance were dealt with at the afternoon and evening sessions of the Maritime Board of Trade meeting here today.

President Lodge's report emphasized the necessity for providing all possible facilities for increasing the usefulness of St. John and Halifax as shipping ports for transatlantic freight. The International management had agreed to add to the new freight tariff to within ten per cent. of the old. He advocated the employment of a permanent secretary to give his whole time to the work.

The taxation question was introduced by Ald. Stuart, Newcastle, who favored tax reform in the direction of cutting off the poll tax, improvements, personal property and income taxes, and increasing the land tax with perhaps a business tax regulated by floor space. There should be no property qualification for voting or holding office. Landless men paid taxes indirectly to the landlord, merchant and hotel keeper. He moved a resolution calling upon the maritime governments and legislatures to grant local option in taxation.

The question of abolishing fishing licenses so as to allow any person to take a fishing license was introduced by Hon. Donald Morrison and finally carried. It came out that the Dominion government controlled the inland fisheries.

President Lodge said that the Miramichi fishing grounds were full of nets. In many rivers sawdust had killed the fishes where there was a danger of becoming known that certain prominent people had taken the drink treatment. Captain Reid claimed that to balance free canals in Quebec and Ontario, the maritime provinces should have railway accommodation at cost. His resolution demanding the reduction of intercolonial freights to the old rate was adopted.
