New Brunswick's First Year's Experience of Union.

The average expenditure in New Brunswick for Roads, Bridges, and Education, for the seven years terminating in October, 1866, was \$233,649 per annum. These ligures clearly show that, as far a the local services are concerned, they are provided for upon a more liberal scale under the Linion arrangement than they were previous to Confederation.
