LACROSSE. NEW RULE PROPOSED. Toronto July 26.—Jimmy Murphy of the Toronto says that at the next meeting of the N.L.C. he will propose a rule aimed against such deliberate fouls as those of Maurice as Newy Lalonde exhibited in Montreal, when he struck Murphy across the face with his stick, two minutes before the conclusion of the match. The ten-minute penalty inflicted became a farce when all Lalonde had to serve was the two minutes remaining to be played. The proposed rule would cover such cases. "In any case where in the closing minutes of any match any player commits an offence, which in the referee's judgment merits a penalty of more than five minutes and the whole or part of such penalty remains unserved at the close of the playing time of such match, such a penalty or such part thereof as remains unserved shall be served by the player so offending in the next league match in which he plays, but such penalty or unserved portion thereof shall in such next match be treated."

BOWLING. THE LONDON TOURNAMENT. London July 25.—Nine of the twelve teams left in the Labatt trophy fell to the wayside at the close of the playing time of such match, such a penalty or such part thereof as remains unserved shall be served by the player so offending in the next league match in which he plays, but such penalty or unserved portion thereof shall in such next match be treated."

OFFER TO GO BACK

Men Will Return to Work on Old Terms, They Say.

PRES. HAYS REFUSES OFFER

In Reply to Advances of Strikers, Who Say They Are Working in the Interests of the Suffering Public Railroad Chief Says Penisons Will Be Forfeited and Must Be Taken on as New Men. Montreal, July 28.—The most important development which has occurred since the strike commenced took place yesterday. In their words, the representatives of the men stated that the strikers were willing to go back to their old jobs as if they had never left the service. In other words, they accepted Mr. Hays' offer of an 18 per cent. increase made to them before they went on strike, and wanted to have each man reinstated and occupy his old position. Their demand also included the restoration of their pensions. The date of increasing the wages to the standard rate was to be submitted to arbitration. This had been promised by Mr. Hays for January 1, 1913, but the men wanted to have this point arbitrated, in the hope of having the standard wage paid them at an earlier date. To their request Mr. Hays said "No," and added: "We have no feeling of anger against our former employees, but you must apply for your jobs as new men, and only on this condition will you be taken back. We hired a number of men in good faith, and we cannot discharge them to make way for those who went on strike. The men who went out will lose their pensions, but those who apply for positions will be taken back, as far as we have room for them. This applies to all except those who committed deeds of violence against the company's employees or property."
