HILLSIDE - ONE FALLS DEAD THE OTHER CANNOT LIVE

A Bloody Tragedy Between Two Young Men which began in Fun on a Street Corner.

BY TELEGRAPH TO THE GAZETTE.

New Albany, Oct. 6.—William Carroll, the 15-year-old son of John Carroll, a painter, and Louis Griggs, a young carpenter, got into a fight as the result of a scuffle begun in fun, and killed each other.

The two had for years been acquaintances on friendly terms. Griggs was slightly crippled. They were standing on the corner with a crowd of young men when the skylarking began. In the midst of it Griggs complained that Carroll had struck him suddenly. Carroll thought it was all in fun and thought there was no cause for a show of temper.

Griggs became more violent at this and Carroll finally said: "If you were not a cripple I'd whip you" and turned away to join the crowd to Griggs' great moment, then quickly drew a big knife, and, coming back, he stabbed Griggs, killing the boy.

Moving around as they talked till he came immediately in front of Carroll, he suddenly drew the knife and plunged it into Carroll's breast. He then drew the knife across the throat toward the right side. Carroll recoiling from the wound and struck Griggs on the head from the ground and checking the flow of blood by grasping the wound in one hand, gave chase to Griggs. Catching him in the left side, screaming frantically, Griggs fought desperately to get loose, but Carroll held him, and drawing the knife stabbed him again and again in the right side, pushing at the knife maker over a fence deep as it could. Griggs sank fainting and Carroll fell dead at his side, the knife had touched his neck. Griggs was taken home but cannot recover.

THE NEW YORK WORLD NEWS-PAPER INTERVIEWS PRESIDENT FINANCIALS.

New York, Oct. 6.—The World News-Paper has interviewed Henry Clegg, former Presidential Staff Adjutant-General, on the financial effects of the tariff. They look for no monetary stringency on Feb. 1, the limit of time for the withdrawal of goods from bond.

Henry Clegg says he is in favor of the present adjustments of the tariff to keep peace with the political stages of the country in growth, both as to population and wealth, and all are agreed that the measure will be highly beneficial to the country.

In the matter of the Erie trouble it is stated that so long as the committee is in session the road will not strike but there will be serious trouble if the committee will wait until Tuesday afternoon for a reply from the company. The committee may be asked to treat the matter fairly but the movement was a complete surprise and the schedule of the Erie was not expected.
