The question being upon the adoption of the report of the Committee, considerable discussion ensued, when,

The hour of 6 o'clock having arrived, the Grand Chancellor declared the Grand Lodge at recess, to meet as soon after the close of Mystic Lodge as possible. The Grand Chancellor said he was requested to ask all the members of the Grand Lodge to attend Mystic Lodge, as one or more Ranks were to be conferred.

FIRST DAY-JUNE 14TH-10 O'CLOCK P.M.

The Grand Lodge assembled pursuant to recess. Present, the Officers and a quorum of Representatives.

Past Chancellor Caiger, of No. 1, was reported in waiting to receive the Grand Lodge Degree. The Grand Master-at-Arms retired and introduced the Past Chancellor, who was then obligated and instructed.

The consideration of the Report of the Committee on Law and Supervision was then resumed. The Grand Chancellor stated that during recess he had examined his Letter Book in reference to the ruling given, and found that he had not given it to his Deputy exactly as quoted in his report, and that it was liable to misconstruction.

Representative Chapman, of No. 3, offered the following, which was adopted:

Resolved, That the report of the Committee on Law and Supervision be not now adopted, but that it be referred back to the Committee, with instructions to frame a resolution to the effect that, in the event of anything being found detrimental to the character of an applicant, after his acceptance and previous to his initiation, he can be refused admittance and his proposition fee be returned.
