

THOUSANDS OF THE HOMELESS CHELSEA PEOPLE FIND SHELTER IN MILITARY TENTS

Property Loss by Yesterday's Great Fire Will be Over \$8,000,000--Three Persons Met Death and Fifty Others Were Injured-- Relief Measures

BOSTON, April 12--Ten thousand persons rendered homeless, at least three burned to death, half a hundred injured, and a property loss of between \$3,500,000 and \$10,000,000, summarizes the record of disaster which confronts the city of Chelsea this morning as a result of the great fire of yesterday.
