FREDERICTON, N. B., July 29 — The St. John River Commission met at ten thirty this morning in the Su-Hamilion—Man Dies as Result of
Brutal Assault by His Son.

TORONTO, July 29—After lingering between life and death as the result of injuries inflicted by his son Arthur, Alfred Drouin died in the Hotel Dieu

at ten thirty this morning in the Su-preme Court chambers with all the members present. Nearly the entire forencon was taken up with the reading and putting in evidence of the various acts of legislature relating to the Fredericton Boom Company and the St. John River Log Driving Company.
