TEMPERATURE OF WATER AFFECTS SEA FISHERIES

From the results of studies made during the summer of 1932 by the Atlantic Fisheries Experimental Sta-tion of the Biological Board of Cation of the Biological Board of Ca-naida it has been found that tempe-rature of the water has much to do with the success of deep sea fishing, according to the Natural Resources according to the Natural Resources
Department of the Canadian National Realways. It was found in the
experiments, which were conducted
in the vicinity of Halifax, that when
the bottom temperature of the water rose above fifty-one degreer Farenheit very few fish are caught.
Young haddock were abundant at
the mouth of Halifax harbor during
last summer and this provided a unique opportunity to institute a number of tests, taking the temperature
of the water along with the number
of fish caught. The practical conclusion which the experiments led
to is that if the fishermen were
to take the temperature of the water
near the bottom while fishing they
would increase their catches accordingly.
