## THE 32nd Victoria, Cap. 54, therefore, in our opinion is valid.

That Act disposes of the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th and 10th objections; for however valid all of these objections might have been before the passing of the 32nd Victoria, any of these objections might have been validly raised by the Act.

2nd. Because the Company may have proceeded to locate, construct, &c., the road without the sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars of Capital Stock having been paid in the manner prescribed by the Act of Incorporation.

3rd. Because it may be doubtful whether any assessment made and notices of same required by the Act are regular unless \$2,000,000 Stock had first been subscribed and \$500,000 paid in.

4th. Because it may be doubtful if notices of calls have been given in accordance with the terms of the Act.
