Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill, to which they desire their concurrence.

The House, according to Order, was adjourned during pleasure, and put into a Committee of the Whole on the Bill (N) intituled: "An Act further to amend the Civil Service Act."

In the Committee.

After some time the House was resumed, and

The Honourable Mr. Ogilvie, from the said Committee, reported that they had gone through the said Bill, and had directed him to report the same to the House without any amendment.

On motion of the Honourable Sir Mackenzie Bowell, seconded by the Honourable

Mr. Desjardins, it was

Ordered, That the said Bill be read a third time presently.

The said Bill was then read a third time accordingly.

The question was put whether this Bill shall pass?

In was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill, to which they desire their concurrence.

The Order of the Day being read for the consideration of the Second Report of the Joint Committee of the Senate and House of Commons on the Printing of Perliament;

On motion of the Honourable Mr. Dever, seconded by the Honourable Mr. Power,

it was

Ordered, That the same be postponed until to-morrow.

The House, according to Order, was adjourned during pleasure, and put into a Committee of the Whole on the Bill (L) intituled: "An Act to amend the Act respecting Wrecks, Casualties and Salvage."

In the Committee.

Title read and postponed.

First clause read and amended as follows:---

Page 1, line 8.—Leave out from "includes" to the end of the Bill and insert: "all movable property not in the actual or constructive possession of the owner thereof, stranded on the shore of, or sunk in or floating on, any navigable water within the territorial limits of Canada."

Title again read and agreed to.

After some time the House was resumed, and

The Honourable Mr. Dever, from the said Committee, reported that they had gone through the said Bill, and had directed him to report the same with an amendment, which he was ready to submit whenever the House would be pleased to receive it.

Ordered, That the Report be now received, and The said amendment was then read by the Clerk.

On motion of the Honourable Sir Mackenzie Bowell, seconded by the Honourable Mr. Desjardins, it was

Ordered, That the said amendment be taken into consideration by the Senate to-morrow.

Then, on motion of the Honourable Sir Mackenzie Bowell, seconded by the Honourable Mr. Desjardins,

The Senate adjourned.
