Will Stage
"Death of a
Salesman"

North Americans being optimistic have never had as much interest in tragedy on the stage as have people of other nations. But all the same one tragedy has become an outstanding hit of our time and it will be staged at the Fredericton Playhouse for three evening performances on Jan. 29, 31, and Feb. 1.

This is the play by Arthur Miller called "Death of a Salesman", which when it was first produced in New York carried off both the Pulitzer Prize and the New York Drama Critics Circle Award. It is only the third play in the history of the American theatre to achieve this double honour. After having been trouped to probably more cities than any other play of modern times, "Death of a Salesman" was then made into a very popular motion picture starring Frederick March.

TEACHERS APPROVE SUB PAYMENT PLAN

Students of New Brunswick Teachers College have voted overwhelmingly in favour of the plan to pay for the new Student Centre. The well attended poll showed over 75% of the college in favour of paying \$10 annually, for a number of years equal to the time UNB and STU pay.

The Building Committee says it expects the period to be about fifteen years.

67% of the freshman class approved the decision. The first payment will be made in the fall of 1966.

"Death of a Salesman" is the story of a time beaten drummer who, as his son says at his funeral at the end of the play, "he never knew who he was". He had clung all his life to a cheerful delusion that he was a successful "big man". But when on the threshold of old age, the hard facts of existence make it almost impossible for him any longer to continue this self-deception, he cannot accept the new picture of himself that he is forced to see.

By means of flashbacks to the significant incidents in his life, when the salesman Willy Loman strutted boastfully in his false beliefs about himself the bitter story is told of his mistake in trying "to get by on a shoeshine and a smile", and of his anguished uncertainty when he finds that

everything he had lived by is false.

The success in all parts of the world of this grim tale has been ascribed to the fact that many of the play's details reach into the lives of all people... that everyone recognizes in it at least some of the things that give him times of panic on sleepless nights.

This tale of a victim with a false code of success has won the reputation of being one of the most tearful plays of our times — and the most hard-boiled members of the play's audiences in New York where it ran for over twenty months have admitted that they wept unashamedly. Yet the play is also said to have an abundance of humour and "recognition" touches that delight its audiences.
