Sir,-

Indian Agent MacLeod has brought to the attention of the Department that there is a dispute between the Indians of the Quesnel Indian reserve and the owner of a lot adjoining the South boundary of that reserve and it has been decided that it would be advisable for Major MacKay to retrace the South boundary of that reserve when in that vicinity. I am enclosing three blueprints containing information relating to this reserve which I would ask you to forward to Major MacKay at Quesnel, together with the field notes of those lots adjoining the South boundary of this reserve, which latter I would request that you obtain from the provincial Surveyor General's office.

The Indian Agent has also suggested that the boundaries be re-established of Lot No. 9032, Cariboo District, which adjoins the Williams Lake Indian reserve No. 3 and was purchased for that band and it is intended that Major MacKay should also do this work. In this connection he will require the field notes of the survey of Lot 9032, which I would request you to obtain from the Surveyor General's office and forward to him with the information relating to the Quesnel Indian reserve No. 1.
