I have received your kind letter of February 11th.


I am sorry that you do not owe me anything, for if you did I know I would get it. The bet was not with you, but with one of your friends. Perhaps you recollect that shortly after the election I told you one day in the National Club of the bet I had made with one of your friends, and I had to win two of the three points. The bet was as follows:

- (1) Premier Ferguson would be High Commissioner in London.
- (2) Within two years Mr. Meighen would be back in public life with the Conservative party in a Cabinet position.
- (3) Mr. Bennett would be chief lieutenant to Mr. Stanley Baldwin in the British Parliament, this also to take place within two years.

I have won on two points, but am delighted to know that I am not going to win on the third. I think, too, that it is a great thing for Canada that you are back in public life at this time.
