Sir,-

In view of the report contained in your letter of the 4th instant, I beg to say that if the season for seeding is ^{not} too far advanced for the Indians to put their land under crop, you may purchase twenty bags of potatoes (ten bags for Indians of Squaw Bay and ten bags for the Indians of Mountain Village). These potatoes should be distributed to the aged members of the Band and you should see that they use the same in planting their land. When sending in an account for the potatoes, you should submit a statement showing the names of the recipients of the seed and the quantity furnished each individual.
