Gentlemen,-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 11th instant addressed to Mr. Orr of this Department, in connection with lot 21 on the east side of King street, Francis survey Sarnia, and in reply to say that this lot was sold on the 10th of January, 1882, to Mr. Donald B. Charleson, who assigned the same to Mr. M. Fleming. Only the first instalment of purchase money having been paid, and the balance of purchase money having been in arrears for many years, the sale of this lot was cancelled by the Department on the 7th of September, 1899, and the lot was re-sold on the 7th of November, 1899, to Mr. Adell G. Gurd, who failed to pay the purchase price and this sale was also cancelled on the 14th of September, 1901, and the lot was again sold on the 10th of March, 1904, to the Ludlam Ainslie Lumber Company, who having paid the purchase price in full, Letters Patent issued to the Company on the 6th of October, 1912, and a return of the issue of this patent was made to the Registrar of the County of Lambton, Sarnia, in the list of patents issued in that district for the quarter ended 31st of December, 1912.
