STATISTICS

The estimated dollar value of contracts awarded by the Department of Munitions and Supply and by its participating and predecessor purchasing bodies from July 14, 1939, to September 30, 1941, amounts to a grand total of nearly \$2,600,000,000.

The above figure includes contracts awarded on Canadian account, contracts placed by the Civil Aviation Division of the Department of Transport on behalf of the British Commonwealth Air Training Plan, commitments made on account of the United Kingdom, and contracts awarded for Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, Greece, the Netherlands, and the United States.
