- 10. The signal for re-forming the procession will be a bow made by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod.
- 11. On this signal, the Aides-de-Camp will move out followed by the Field Officer-in-Waiting.
- As soon as His Excellency and Her Royal Highness, with their party, have formed in procession, Air Marshal Breadner and Major-General Browne will move out and form in procession, remainder following as for entrance.
- On arrival at His Excellency's Dressing Room, procession will halt and put on head-dress.
- When His Excellency comes out of Dressing Room, procession will proceed to the Main Door of Parliament Buildings.
- 15. On arrival at inside steps of the Main Entrance, the Aides-de-Camp will incline right and left, and the procession will pass through them. When Air Marshal Breadner and Major-General Browne reach the foot of the Stairway the procession will halt.
- 16. Remain in position until His Excellency and Her Royal Highness's car drives away.
