In the same Act, the Government has
been given power to call up and enroll in the
Eilitary Porces for service in Canada the entire
male population of military age in the country.
This provision has been exercised to the extent
of calling up, in successive groups, young men
of twenty-one for periods of four months training,
after which they are require to remain in the
Porces for the duration of the War to serve in
the defence of Canada.

In actual experience many of them volunteered to join the Active Service Forces for service anywhere.

Some 15,000 are beingtrained for home defence duties in Canada, thus relieving Active Army troops for service abroad if need be.
