PROTESTANT ACADEMY.

This excellent institution was erected in 1870, by the Wesleyan Methodists of the city, and retained their name until August, 1876, when it came under the joint auspices of the Methodist and Presbyterian Churches, at which time the new name was substituted. It is situated on Haviland Street, at a convenient distance from the crowded part of the city, occupying the most commanding site which the city affords. It is substantially built of brick, three stories high. Its internal arrangements, for adaptation to the work of teaching, leave nothing further to be desired. The rooms are spacious and lofty, and perfectly ventilated. The stair cases are large and well adapted to easy entrance and exit. The building is heated in winter by steam. No pains or cost have been spared by the trustees to make this school very desirable for the youth of our island; where they may successfully pre-The terms compare for honorable positions in future life. mence, as follows: Summer, August 28th; Autumn, November 9th; Winter, February 1st; Spring, April 17th. A full list of the staff will be found in the educational department of this work.

ST. PETER'S SCHOOL,

in connection with and adjoining St. Peter's Church, is situated on Rotchford Square. In the Boys' School the subjects taught are the English branches, Classics, Mathematics, French and Grammar. Rev. John Ellis, Master; Mr. W. C. Wilson, Assistant Master. In the Girls' School are taught the higher branches of an English education, French and Grammar, Music and Singing. Teachers, Miss Williams and Miss Harris.

ST. DUNSTAN'S COLLEGE.

This institution stands about a mile and a half from Charlottetown, on a very pleasing site, near the Malpeque Road. The building, which has lately been enlarged, is ample and capable of accommodating over one hundred boarders. There are three professors, and a rector. The course embraces all the branches of an English education, Mathematics, Classics, Greek and Latin, Natural Philosophy, Chemistry, Logic, and Metaphysics. The classes open in September and close in July, with the usual Christmas recess.

CONVENT OF THE CONGREGATION OF NOTRE DAME.

This brick building, four stories high, is one of the most imposing educational structures in the lower provinces. It stands on Sydney Street, on the South side of Hillsborough
