August .- Now that land in the older settled townships has been so often picked over, that none but what is called inferior is to be had, the swales and swamps attract attention. People look at the deep black soil and wet ground and long to attack it, but are afraid. The general run of farmers little know what may be done with such property; but those who have once ditched swales, prefer the deep, rich fatness of such places to inferior dry ground. There is scarcely any land which has not some run to it—it slopes one way or the other—and therefore can be thoroughly drained.
