Matrimony Tart.—Pare and core about a dozen nice-sized apples; put them into a sauce-pan with a little water to keep them from burning; boil them until you can pulp them, (but do not forget to frequently stir them,) then add a quarter of a pound of currants, two ounces of candied peel, and enough sugar to sweeten it nicely; if liked, also a little grated nutmeg. Pour this mixture into a large tart-tin or dish that has previously been lined with a thin paste. Then roll out another piece the same size and thickness, which place over the top; press the edges together all round, make a hole in the centre, the same as for mince-pies, and bake.
