THE CANADIAN NORTH-WEST

HOMESTEAD

REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-west Territories, excepting 8 and 26, which has not been homesteaded, or reserved to provide word lost for settlers, of for other purposes, may 12 homesteaded upon by any person who its the sole head of a handly, or any male over by years of age, to the extent of one-quarter sec-tion of 109 acres, none or 1682.

ENTRY.

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the District in which the land to be taken in situate, or if the homestacader desires he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of a limitgration, Winnipeg, or the Local Agent for the district for which the landse entry for him and free of \$10 is charged for a homestead entry

HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted an entry for somestead is required by the provisions of the minion fands Act and the amendments ereto to perform the conditions connected erewith, under one of the following plans: -

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is decased) or any person who is eligible to make a homestead entry upon the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a home-stead, the requirements of this Act as to re-sidence prior to obtaining patern may satisfied by such person resulting with the father or mother.

(3) If a settler has obtained a picture of the hometened, or a corrilation for the instance of acceleration of the instance of the instance pre-scribed by this Act, and has obtained entry for a second hometend, the requirements of this Act as to real-free may be and it the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his household, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same township or an adjoining or cornering township.

A solider who avails himself of the provision. of Chauses (2)(3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stocks with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 80 acres substantially fenced.

Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homesteader law is liable to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

Should be made at the end of the three years before the Local Agent, SuirAgent or the form at the insector. Hefere making applica-tion for patent the settler must give als nonthe notice in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of his intention to do so.

INFORMATION

Nearly serired immigrants will receive at the finningstain office in Winnings, or at any formition lands office in Manitoba or the North-west Territories information as to the elinds that are open for entry, and from the officers in charge, free of expense, advice and assistance in accerting lands to suit timber, coal indo minoral laws, as well as respecting Dominion Lands in the Railway Belt in British Columbia, may be obtained upon ap-plication to the Secretary of the Department of the Interior.
