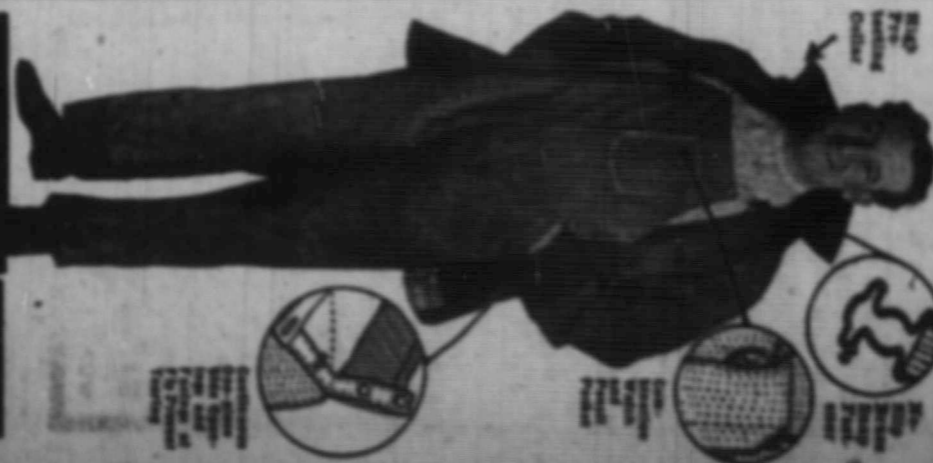

### Alberta

For Alberta the Free Press says that

will have: Wheat, 10,500,000 bushels;  
oats, 7,995,000; barley, 2,335,200; rye,  
134,000, and flax, 420,000, or a cash  
value at present prices of \$323,235,120."

### Saskatchewan Government Figures

Regina, Sept. 7.—The final crop esti-  
mate of the provincial department of  
agriculture shows a yield in wheat for  
Saskatchewan of 96,464,845 bushels  
from an acreage of 9,101,000, giving a  
proportional average of 10.8 bushels of  
wheat per acre. The value of the 1917  
wheat crop was estimated by Hon. T.  
Dunsmuir in the course of his budget  
speech last session at \$225,236,000. The  
yield estimated by the department of  
agriculture for 1918, based on a valua-  
tion of \$2.24 per bushel, equals a total  
of \$220,261,252, or only \$4,974,748 short  
of last year.

The estimate, which is based on the  
reports of about 900 correspondents in  
all parts of the province, indicates that  
the average yield will be much higher  
than expected a few months ago, the  
rains in July and the cool weather dur-  
ing the period when the wheat was ill-  
ing have resulted in a wonderful change  
in crop conditions. It will be remem-  
bered that the crop has suffered by  
drought and hot winds more in the  
northwestern and west central districts.  
These are comparatively new districts  
and the farmers in this part of the  
province have a smaller percentage of  
their land summerplowed than in the  
eastern and central districts. The acre-  
age in the west is much smaller than in  
the other districts and therefore a low  
average yield does not affect the total  
wheat production to the same extent as  
a failure in the older districts.
