" ANSWER of His Excellency the Lieutenant Gov" ernor to the Address of the Assembly this day presented,

"THOS. CARLETON.

"Gentlemen,

"HAVE the satisfaction to feel, with you, a just confi-"dence in the ready personal co-operation of all His "MAJESTY's subjects in this province on every occasion for the general desence; and I hope that, on a surther consideration of this important subject, you will be convinced of the

"indispensible duty incumbent on us all, not only by every personal exertion, but by every other necessary means in our

" power, to provide for the safety and defence of the province.

"If any emergency should arise, requiring efforts or provifions clearly beyond our ability, we can have no doubt of the necessary aid and protection of the Parent State. But until the evident existence of such a situation, I should consider any application made in that view on my part as injurious to the reputation of the province.
