Customs Returns.

Yesterday was a record day for customs collected for this point, \$6,609.62 being taken in. Previous yesterday the largest collection was made March 14th, 1911, when \$6,235.62 was gathered in by His Majesty's servants.

Ward from Kane.

Glad tidings were received from Manager Ambrose Kane, by President Nelson of the ball club this morning. Kane has signed up Albert, a clever shortstop, who hails from Lawrence, and all he needs now is one more pitcher. Harry Donovan is still a hold-out but he is expected within the fold very soon. Kane will scout around Brockton, Lynn and New Bedford before he comes here. He is confident he will have a fine team.

Will Visit Canada.

A big party of German business men will visit Canada this summer and will be in Toronto Aug. 9-13. Brantford is not included in the itinerary of the party, but an effort will be made by the civic authorities to have the visitors come to Brantford, at least for a few hours. Mayor Hartman who is conversant with the German language, it is believed, would be equal to the occasion of impressing the entire party with the importance of this industrial centre for investment purposes.

Debate at Colborne Street.

A large number were present at the young people's meeting at Colborne street church to listen to a debate on: "Resolved that the liquor traffic has done more to retard civilization than war." The affirmative was taken by Mr. H. Farley, leader; Mr. R. Frayne and Mr. F. Mann; negative—Mr. Lockington, leader; Mr. Joyce and Mr. H. V. Hutton. The affirmative were declared the winners by a very narrow margin.

Pickpockets Active.

As reported in The Courier last night pickpockets have been actively engaged at railway depots, a well-known Brantford man having been cleverly touched on Monday. A Toronto despatch to-day says: Benjamin Ainsworth of Lisle, Ont., lost \$200 yesterday at the Union Station, and suspects that his pocket was picked. Mr. Ainsworth was carrying a crate of eggs, and says that he was jostled in the crowd by two men, but did not miss his money until he reached the car. Four hundred dollars which was in another pocket was not touched. A man coming from Hamilton was robbed of twenty-five dollars and his ticket, while Mr. Lorne Mitchell of the C. N. R. had \$175 taken from his pocket while on the way to the train a few days ago. Mr. Robert Kinney lost a ticket and thirty-five dollars on the station platform and on the train. From these recent losses it looks as if a gang of pickpockets are working in the vicinity of the station.

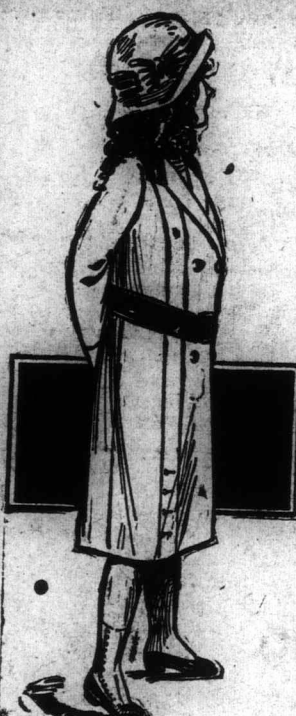

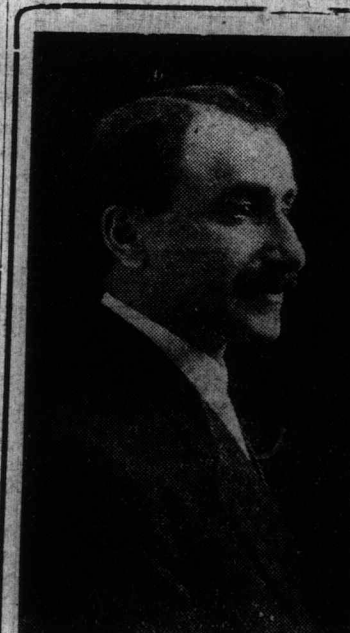
